

Harmony Ridge Showcases Holly Fetting, Ext. 5544 Director of Life Enrichment

For the month of January, we are pleased to display wooden bowls and vases made in the CKV Woodshop by John Laudermilch. John moved to Cross Keys in 2017 and soon joined the woodshop, where he learned to turn bowls on the lathe. He chooses a piece of wood, studying the color variations and unique grain before designing a bowl. A wide variety of wood species are used to make these items. Many hours are spent at a lathe in the woodshop, followed by sanding and applications of oil finishes. Some bowls are finished with food-safe oils; others receive Tung oil. In 2024, John began making vases for dried flowers. They were made by gluing together different woods before turning.

All bowls and vases are for sale with a percentage of proceeds given to the Good Samaritan Fund and to the woodshop. To purchase, contact John at 717-624-2282.
