Making Gifts via a Gift Annuity Don Wilkinson, Ext. 6497 Foundation Department

Did you know that you can make a lifetime gift to a family member or friend using a charitable gift annuity? While often a gift annuity is set up to provide income to the person(s) who establish the annuity, it is possible to “make a lifetime gift” to someone else using this giving arrangement. Here is an example of how this can work.

Mr. and Mrs. Jones want to provide a gift to their son, daughter, or other person and have them receive the gift, for example, on their birthday. So, they establish a gift annuity and designate that person as the recipient of the annuity payments. They designate that the payment is to be made to the beneficiary on that person’s birthday. Mr. and Mrs. Jones receive a charitable deduction for establishing the annuity, and their beneficiary designee receives a “birthday gift” annually from them. Or the payment could be set up to be made at Christmas so that the beneficiary gets a “Christmas present” from them each year for the remainder of the beneficiary’s life.

We have had folks do both types of arrangements and thus give lifetime gifts to a family member or friend. If you would like more information about this type of gift arrangement, please contact the Foundation office.
