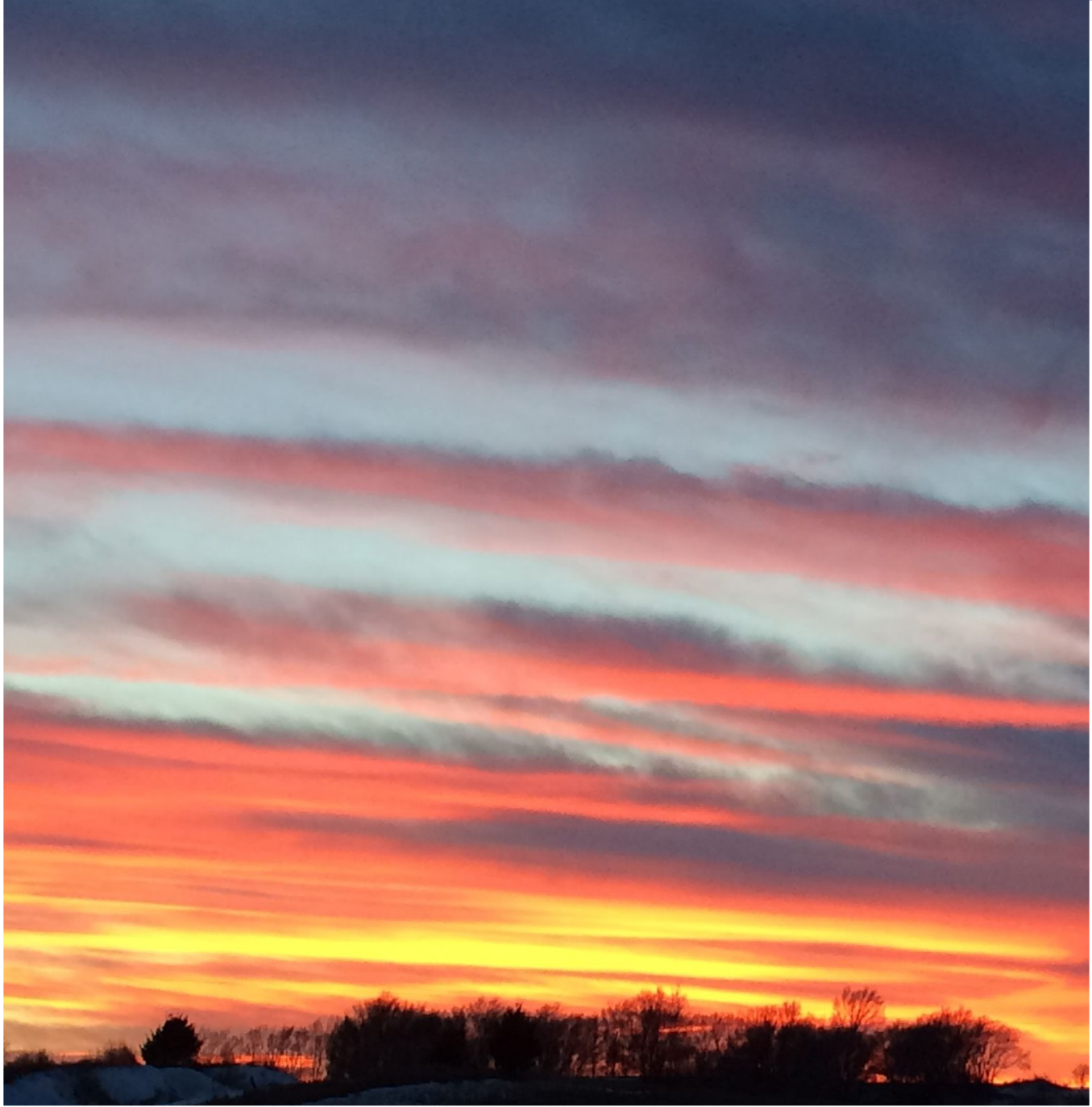

Reducing Federal Income Tax Don Wilkinson, Ext. 6497 Foundation Office

IRAs have become a very popular source of retirement income. However, the federal government requires some individuals to withdraw money annually from their traditional IRA and pay federal income tax on the amount withdrawn. This is referred to as RMD, required minimum distribution. Currently you must begin these mandatory withdrawals in the year that you reach 73 years of age.

For those who contribute regularly to non-profits, such as your church or other 501C(3) organizations, you can legally avoid paying income tax on amounts that you are required to withdraw by donating to your charity directly from your IRA. For the year 2025, the amount eligible for this “tax deduction” is any amount up to \$108,000.

Here is an example of how this works. If an individual is required to withdraw \$10,000 from their IRA, that money must be reported as taxable income on their federal return. If they are in a 22% tax bracket, they will pay an additional \$2200 in federal income tax. However, if the individual donates \$5,000 of that required withdrawal to their church or other charity, they pay no tax on that portion of the required withdrawal resulting in a reduction of \$1100 in federal income tax. The money donated is considered a QCD, qualified charitable distribution.

Anyone over the age of 70½ years is eligible to get a QCD. If you have questions about this method of reducing the amount of federal income tax that you pay, please call our office at 717-624-5208.



What’s Truly Needed Pastor Linda Titzell, Ext. 5580

You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions. - Mark 7:8

While preparing a meal, a young mother cut a pot roast in half before she put it in a large pot. Her husband asked her why she cut the meat in half. She replied, “Because that’s the way my mother does it.”

Her husband’s question, however, piqued the woman’s curiosity. So she asked her mother about the tradition. She was shocked to learn that her mother cut the meat so it would fit in the one small pot she used. And because her daughter had many large pots, the act of cutting the meat was unnecessary.

Many traditions begin out of a necessity but are carried on without question—becoming “the way we do it.” It’s natural to want to hold on to human traditions—something the Pharisees were doing in their day. They were distracted by what seemed like the breaking of one of their religious rules. As Jesus said to the Pharisees, “You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions.” He revealed that traditions should never replace the wisdom of Scripture. A genuine desire to follow God will focus on the attitude of our heart rather than outward actions.

It’s a good idea to consistently evaluate traditions, anything we hold close to our heart and follow religiously. The things that God has revealed to be truly needed should always supersede traditions.
