Favorite Hymns for Lent Pastor Linda Titzell, Ext. 5580

We don't necessarily think of Lent as a time to sing. But there are many hymns of Lent that can carry us through this lovely, spiritually rich season. Here is musical inspiration for this transformative time.

- 1) "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" - What great reminder that God's grace is there to carry us through whatever trials we face. The verse that moves me the most: "Let thy goodness like a fetter bind my wandering heart to thee." May I be the Lord's prisoner forever.
- 2) "Dear Lord and Father of Mankind" - American poet John Greenleaf Whittier understood how necessary it is to turn to God, asking for forgiveness. Prayer is at the heart of that process. "Drop thy still dews of quietness, Till all our strivings cease..." What a perfect prayer for Lent.
- 3) "Take My Life, and Let it Be" - The words of a Lent hymn, like this one, stick in your soul. Like Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37).
- 4) "Be Still, My Soul" - Lent is a great time to practice contemplative prayer. Our minds can be noisy with distractions. But when we give all those worries and concerns over to the Lord, we can be still: "Be still my soul thy best, thy heavenly friend..."
- 5) "Amazing Grace" - Everybody's favorite hymn. During our Lenten journey, it feels especially appropriate. "Through many dangers, toils and snares, I have already come. 'Tis grace that brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home." Those toils that Jesus endured in the wilderness, that we honor at Lent, can only be endured through God's grace. May it be with you.

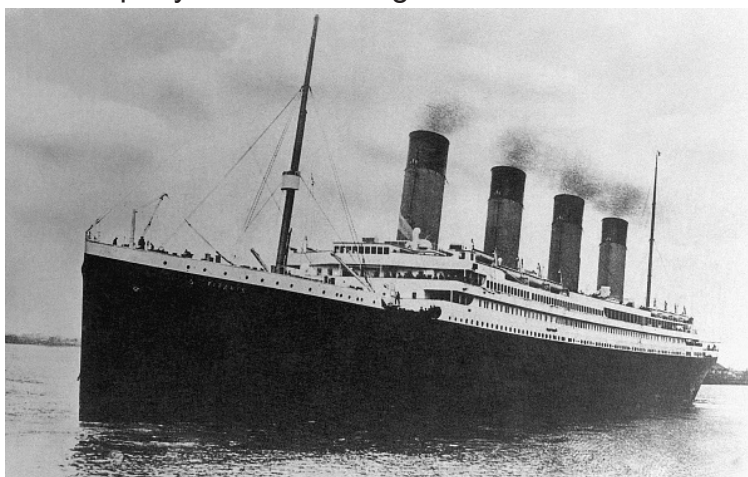

The tuber from the root of a tapioca plant is also used to make sola flowers. Sola wood flowers are incredibly light and soft and can easily take on the appearance of an authentic flower. They look like real flowers and last a lifetime.
