### **Pet Owner Reminders**

As the air gets warmer and the sun gets brighter, spending quality time with our best companions becomes a campus-wide activity. While you are out and about, please remember that Villagers who own pets are fully responsible for their behavior while outside, in campus buildings, and in homes. Here are a few reminders per the Cross Keys Village Pet Agreement that can be found in the Villager Handbook.

Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets everywhere on campus. Pets must always be kept on a leash both inside community buildings and outside for everyone's safety. Leashes should be no longer than 6 ft. inside buildings or around other people.

Pets may not be placed outside on chains or leashes and left unattended at any time. If you have a chain or leash in your yard, please remove it immediately. If you know of someone who leaves their pet out on a chain or leash unattended, please report it to either Security or the Residential Living Team.

Pets may enter the Harmony Ridge buildings but must always be well-disciplined. Cross Keys Village reserves the right to refuse entry to campus buildings if owners are unable to control the behavior of their pets.
