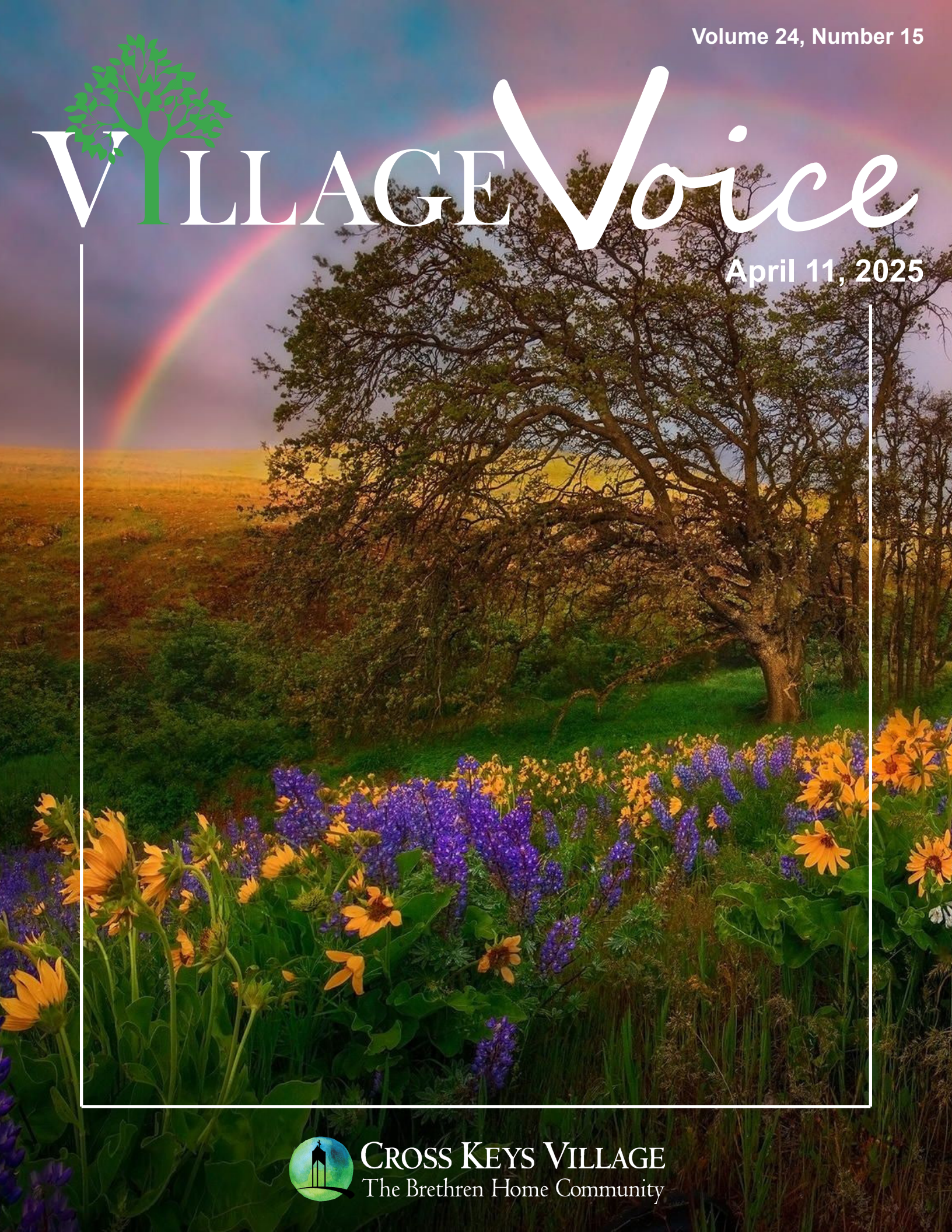

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday, the day Jesus entered Jerusalem in a manner that fulfilled messianic prophecies. Often called the Triumphal Entry, this event is commemorated on the Sunday before Resurrection Sunday. In the Gospel accounts, Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a colt, while a crowd spreads palm branches and cloaks along the road.

The prophecy comes from Zechariah 9:9: “Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout in triumph, O Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your King comes to you, righteous and victorious, humble and riding on a donkey—on a colt, the foal of a donkey.”

Palms represented victory, celebration, and homage. John 12:13 notes the crowd “took palm branches and went out to meet Him.” Such branches signified honor and festive welcome.

The donkey holds symbolic meaning. In ancient Near Eastern cultures, a donkey signified peace. Conquering kings rode stallions; peacemaking kings rode donkeys to demonstrate humility and convey peaceful intent. By selecting a donkey, Jesus highlighted His role as the prophesied Prince of Peace.

Another key aspect is the cry of “Hosanna!” from

the crowds. The word “Hosanna” is derived from a Hebrew phrase that meant “Save, please,” a hopeful plea for deliverance, acknowledging Jesus as the Savior.

Palm Sunday reveals a profound spiritual truth: the Messiah comes humbly yet powerfully to bring genuine salvation. The entry invites recognition that Jesus is not only a teacher or prophet but the promised King.

Palm Sunday inaugurates the events culminating in the crucifixion and resurrection. After his triumphant entry, Jesus spends the following days teaching, confronting religious authorities, and preparing His disciples for His impending sacrifice. By the end of the week, Jesus is sentenced to death, crucified, and laid in a tomb, only to rise from the dead three days later. Thus, Palm Sunday cannot be separated from Resurrection Sunday – it inaugurates “Holy Week.”

By commemorating Palm Sunday, the narrative of redemption is displayed: the King has come, the crowd rejoices, the journey to the crucifixion and resurrection is set in motion. In celebrating this event, believers echo the centuries-old cry: “Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!”

As the spring holidays approach, and the opportunities for travel increase, there are a few reminders Villagers should consider when making travel plans. Per page 27 of the Villager Handbook, when a Villager decides to go away for an extended period (2 - 3 days or more), CKV-TBHC asks Villagers to notify us of the departure and return date. This is done for several reasons:

- Peace of mind that your home is safe (Facility Maintenance and Security is notified).
- During or after severe weather, your home is checked for possible problems.
- CKV-TBHC will be able to contact you if there is an emergency within your home.
- To notify CKV-TBHC of your plans, please contact the Residential Living Reception Desk at ext. 5411 or 717-624-5411, or the Mission

Point Reception Desk by dialing "0" or 717-624-2161. You will be asked for your name, your departure and return dates, destination, and a contact phone number for you or someone who can reach you.

There are some preventive maintenance procedures to follow for those Villagers who like to travel and be gone for several weeks or months at a time. For more details and assistance, please contact the Facility Maintenance Department at ext. 5291 or 717-624-5291.

Your U.S. Postal mail can be held or forwarded for prolonged trips by visiting the New Oxford or Abbottstown Post Office or USPS.com and completing the pertinent forms. CKV-TBHC does not handle or withhold mail that is delivered by the U.S. Postal Service.

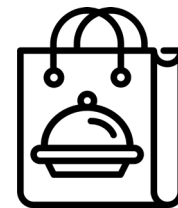
